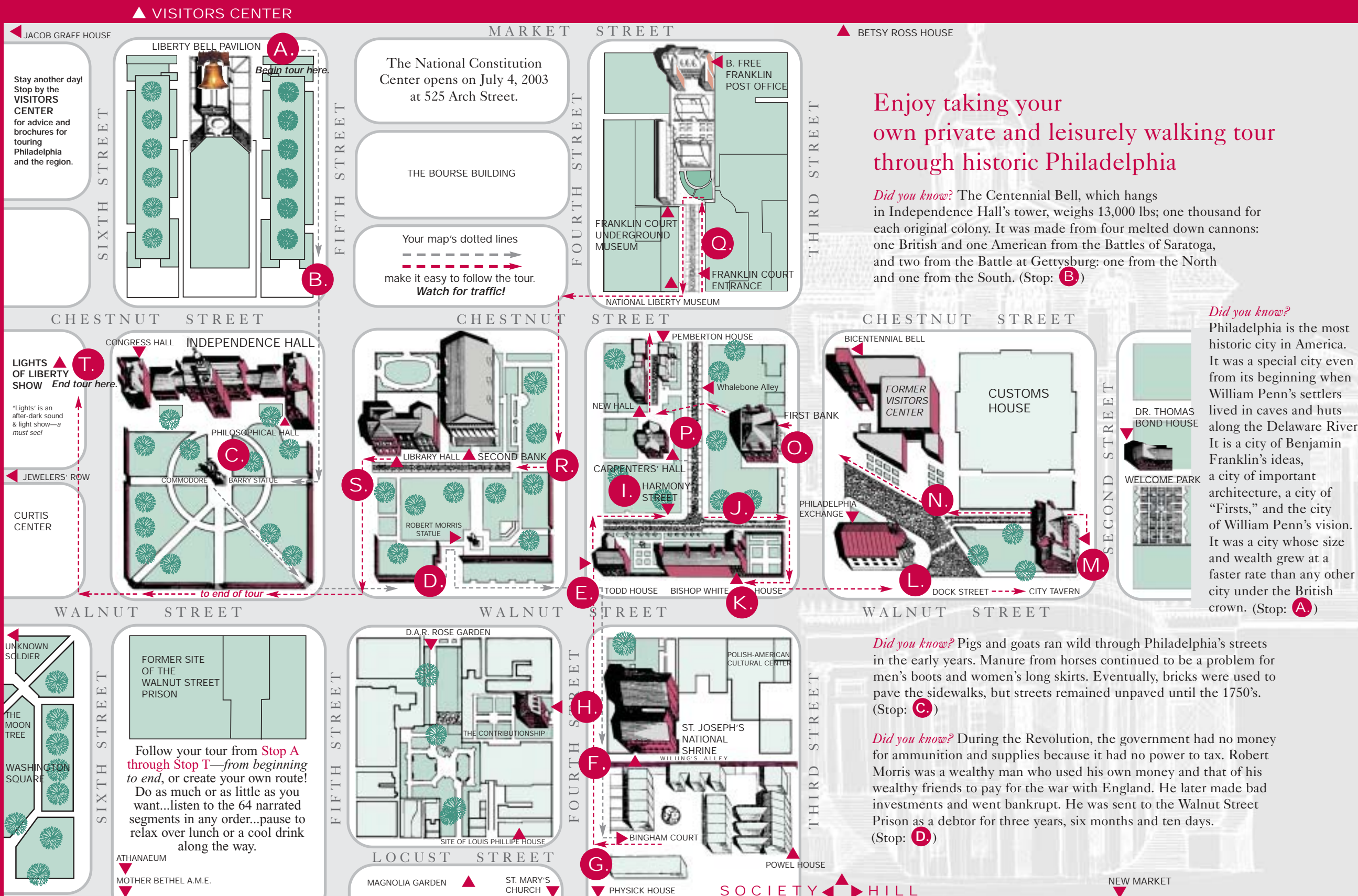

Enjoy taking your own private and leisurely walking tour through historic Philadelphia

Did you know? The Centennial Bell, which hangs in Independence Hall's tower, weighs 13,000 lbs; one thousand for each original colony. It was made from four melted down cannons: one British and one American from the Battles of Saratoga, and two from the Battle at Gettysburg: one from the North and one from the South. (Stop: **B**)

Did you know? Philadelphia is the most historic city in America. It was a special city even from its beginning when William Penn's settlers lived in caves and huts along the Delaware River. It is a city of Benjamin Franklin's ideas, a city of important architecture, a city of "Firsts," and the city of William Penn's vision. It was a city whose size and wealth grew at a faster rate than any other city under the British crown. (Stop: **A**)

Did you know? Pigs and goats ran wild through Philadelphia's streets in the early years. Manure from horses continued to be a problem for men's boots and women's long skirts. Eventually, bricks were used to pave the sidewalks, but streets remained unpaved until the 1750's. (Stop: **C**)

Did you know? During the Revolution, the government had no money for ammunition and supplies because it had no power to tax. Robert Morris was a wealthy man who used his own money and that of his wealthy friends to pay for the war with England. He later made bad investments and went bankrupt. He was sent to the Walnut Street Prison as a debtor for three years, six months and ten days. (Stop: **D**)
