WHEREAS, National History Day is a 2011 National Humanities Medalist, our nation's highest award for excellence in the Humanities, and

WHEREAS, School District of Philadelphia students are enriched by problem-based learning, team building, portfolio assessment, and integrated STEM and writing through historical research projects, and

WHEREAS, This year 639 Philadelphia students, grades 6 through 12, competed in Philadelphia National History Day with 74 students advancing to the Pennsylvania State Finals, and

WHEREAS, Each year, thousands of middle and high school students and teachers across the United and around the world participate in National History Day, a yearlong educational program that ends in a culminating contest every June in Washington, D.C., and
